The Exam: Format

Phase 1: Eligibility assessment: on line submission

Phase 2: MCQ examination (usually end of June)

Phase 3: Oral examination (usually last weekend in September)

Part A: Written exam (MCQs): web-based







The web-based "written" exam

- continuous supervision
- e-methods to avoid cheating











- Strong internet connection
- Latest update version of your browser

The web-based "written" exam



- 50 MCQs; total time allocated is 120 minutes
- Can scroll between questions back and forwards, mark as unsure to be reminded to go back before you finish
- Usually 5 options, only one correct "best of five" principle
- No negative scoring for wrong answers

The web-based "written" exam



- Pass rate variable, usually ≈60%, calculated each time using an international standard-setting procedure (Anghoff Scoring)
- Results by e mail, approximately within 1 week
- Only if MCQ is passed you can progress to the Oral exam

The Oral exam








- ✓ Case discussion 1 (30 minutes)

- ✓ Review of a scientific paper on breast surgery (paper given 48h before the exam, 30 minutes)


The virtual Oral exam What will you need?


- A room where you can be alone for about 2 hours

The Oral exam



- ✓ Case discussion
- 10 questions
- 2 examinersscoring independently:

2 points: expected answer, effectively supported
1 point: knowledge of the subject but, answer different from guidelines; however, "reasonable" and well supported
0 points: completely wrong answer, different to international guidelines, no knowledge of the subject

Oral Clinical Exam

- Stations with 2 examiners, 30 minutes per station over 2 days.
- Very much like a mock MDT discussing an interesting case with a senior colleague.
- Candidates are given a scenario and then 10 questions, which may include the interpretation of imaging and clinical photography.

Academic Paper Viva

- 30 minute Viva with 2 examiners about a recent academic paper.
- Paper sent out to candidates 48 hours before the exam.
- Structured questions focussing partly on <u>methodological quality</u> and <u>study design</u> and partly on <u>clinical impact</u> and <u>interpretation</u>.
- Previous papers have included the Z11 trial and Tailor X

Final results

Given on the same day

(or within **14 days** for the **virtual exam**)

• Pass rate for the EBSQ exam is:

70-75% for the MCQ and

80-85% for the Oral exam
